Basic Tips for Art Presentations

- 1. Always start with a blank presentation. Do not use design templates with extra graphics and bright colors.
- 2. Never use TIFF image files. They are too big! Always use JPEG files.
- 3. Use black backgrounds to electronically mask the edges of images. Use white text.
- 4. Add an extra blank slide (black background) at the beginning of your presentation. This allows you to open your presentation file and warm-up the projector without revealing your first slide until you are ready to start your talk.
- 5. To retain correct image proportions, only resize images from the corner handles. Beware of risking image quality, including pixilation, when enlarging images.
- 6. Add important text to the top of slides to insure that all viewers have an unobstructed view.
- 7. Avoid all animations, slide transitions, and fancy text formatting that detracts from the works of art.
- 8. Finally, for PC users, in the Picture toolbar, compress all images to 96 dpi for web/screen viewing when your presentation is complete. This will keep your overall file size manageable and loading quickly during your presentation.

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
